1. What were the conditions in Russia that led to a revolution which gave way to becoming a communist nation?
2. What factors led to the Soviet Union's rise to become one of two global powers after the Second World War?
3. Over the course of the twentieth century how did China go from a nation being imperialized to one of the top global powers?
4. Why did the communist movement spread across so many different parts of the globe?
5. After the fall and breakup of the Soviet Union, how did the role of ethnicities create unrest in the newly formed countries process of becoming democratic?

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
